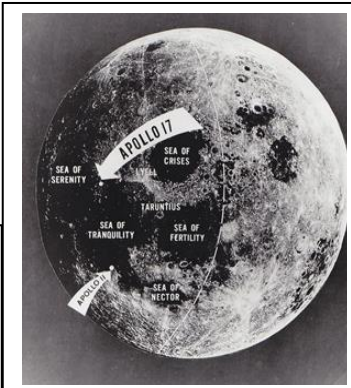
All Saints' Day occurs on November 1st; and is celebrated the first Sunday of November. We remember and celebrate all saint who are now triumphant in heaven. A “Saint” in the biblical sense is any Christian. All Saints' Day was first declared on May 13 in 609 AD by Pope Boniface IV. He consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the virgin Mary and all the martyrs. November 1 was established by Pope Gregory III during his reign (731-741 AD), during which he dedicated a chapel in St. Peter’s Basilica, honoring “all saints.” One hundred years later, Pope Gregory IV made All Saints' Day an official Holy Day worldwide. We will remember the saints with a candle lighting and a procession of our All Saints’ Banner on Sunday, November 6th.

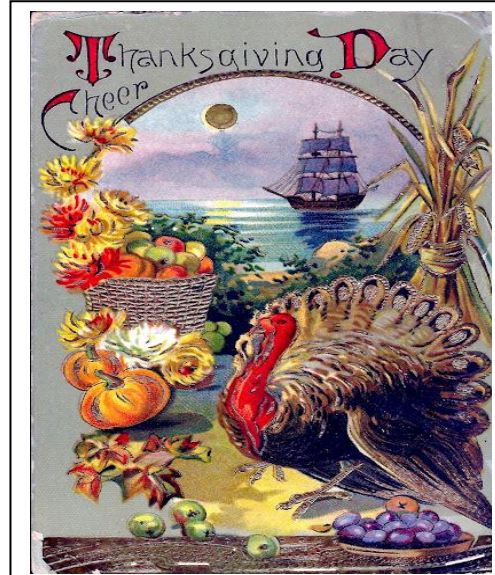
