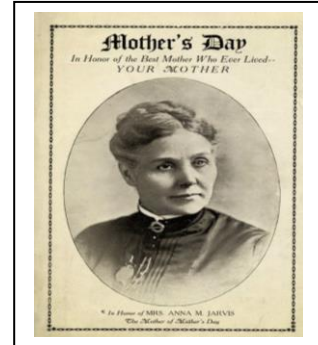

Methodist Roots in Mother's Day

Celebrating Mother's Day in America began with Methodist Roots at a special service in 1907 at Andrews Episcopal Church in Gafton, West Virginia. The service was organized by a Methodist woman, Anna Jarvis, to honor her mother, Ann Jarvis, who died May 9, 1905. Anna Jarvis had cared for wounded soldiers during the Civil War. When the war was over, they brought mothers on both sides together with a Mother's Day Friendship luncheon. In 1908, Anna Jarvis advocated that all mothers be honored on the second Sunday of May. In 1910 West Virginia became first state to recognize Mother's Day. In 1914 President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed Mother's Day as a national holiday.

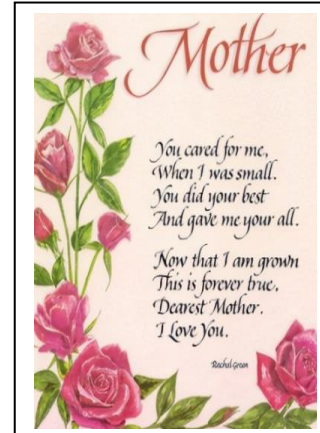
