Reformation Day is October 31. We will celebrate **Reformation Day on Sunday, October 30**. Reformation Day marks the start of the Protestant Reformation by Martin Luther. He became a monk after being struck by lightning, and, later a professor at Whittenburg University. 505 years ago on October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses to the wall of the church at Whittenburg Castle. He opposed the Roman Catholic hierarchy of visiting relics, paying for Masses and the sale of indulgences (used to buy people's freedom from past sins). He championed using people's own language, instead of only Latin in worship. He believed that Christ justifies us by faith alone - not works as the Roman Catholics taught. This day is for all Protestants: Methodists, Baptists, Lutherans, Anglicans, Pentecostals and Presbyterians.

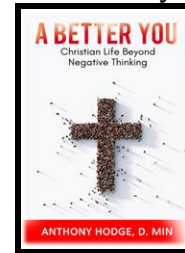

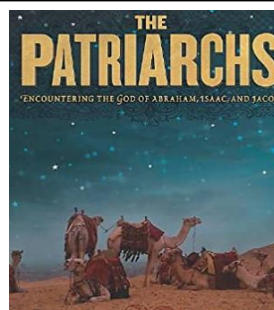
